Author and Journalist Ann Crittenden to Speak at Montgomery College March 25
Award-winning writer speaks on “Motherhood and Money: Hidden Costs, Hidden Values”

Pulitzer Prize-nominated journalist, author, and lecturer Ann Crittenden will hold a lecture and book signing on Thursday, March 25 from 11 a.m.–12:15 p.m. in the Theatre Arts Arena at Montgomery College’s Rockville Campus, 51 Mannakee Street, Rockville, Md. Crittenden’s talk, “Motherhood and Money: Hidden Costs, Hidden Values” will focus on her provocative and groundbreaking book “The Price of Motherhood” and her most recent book, “If You’ve Raised Kids, You Can Manage Anything.”

Crittenden’s “If You’ve Raised Kids, You Can Manage Anything,” received critical praise and was featured in People magazine. Her previous book, “The Price of Motherhood,” garnered widespread media attention and was named one of The New York Times Notable Books of the Year in 2001.

Crittenden worked as a reporter for The New York Times for eight years, writing on a broad range of economic topics. She initiated numerous investigative reports and received a Pulitzer Prize nomination. Previously, she wrote for Newsweek and Fortune magazine. She also served as a visiting lecturer at MIT and Yale, an economics commentator for CBS News, and the executive director of the Fund for Investigative Journalism.

A native of Dallas, Texas, Crittenden is a graduate of Southern Methodist University and the Columbia University School of International Affairs, where she earned a Ph.D. She is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and has served on the board of the International Center for Research on Women.
