Montgomery College Board of Trustees Launch Search for Next President
Presidential Search Web Site Now Online, Applications and Nominations Being Accepted

Montgomery College's Board of Trustees has launched its national search for the next president to head Montgomery College, a multi-campus, public community college in Montgomery County, Md. Applications and nominations for the position are now being accepted, and advertisements will appear in various regional and higher education publications beginning March 12.

The presidential advertisement indicates that the Board is seeking "an experienced, visionary leader with a strong track record of accomplishments." Candidates should have at least 15 years of progressively responsible experience in higher education administration or other relevant experience, including 3–5 years as a chancellor, president, or senior vice president at a large, complex institution.

The Presidential Search Advisory Committee, a 17-member committee from Montgomery College and the surrounding community, and the executive search firm Greenwood/Asher & Associates, Inc. will assist the Board of Trustees with the presidential search. The committee and the firm have helped create a profile of desired characteristics that will help guide the search process. Next, they will reach out and identify potential candidates, review qualifications, and present the finalists to the Board of Trustees for consideration.

The Board of Trustees will invite the finalists to the College for interviews. The top finalists will participate in forums with the College community.
