Applicants for this grant and their parents must be permanent residents of Maryland. Students must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents attending a secondary school in Maryland. The grant may pay the cost of one three credit hour course per semester, depending on available funds. Home-schooled students are not eligible for this grant.
- MC Board of Trustees High School Grant**
Applicants for this grant must be Montgomery County high school students. The grant pays the cost of one course per semester, depending on available funds. Currently, home-schooled students pursuing a high school diploma are eligible for this grant.
- MC College Institute Grant**
Applicants for this grant must be Montgomery County high school students enrolled in the MC College Institute. The grant may cover tuition, fees, and books for courses offered through the College Institute, depending on financial need and available funds.

2012-2013 High School Grant Application

Students **currently enrolled in high school** and taking classes at Montgomery College (MC) may apply for the following need-based grants:

- Maryland State Dual Enrollment Grant
- MC Board of Trustees High School Grant
- MC College Institute Grant

Students applying for any of these grants must meet the following conditions:

- Students must be properly admitted to Montgomery College for fall 2012, spring 2013, or summer 2013. They must have approval from their high school guidance counselors to register for classes at MC; or they must have been admitted into College Institute or the Early Placement program through the Office of Concurrent Enrollment Programs.
- A copy of the custodial parent's (parents') 2011 signed complete federal income tax return listing the student as a dependent, must accompany the grant application. (If a student does not live with both parents, the custodial parent is the one the student lived with most during the past 12 months.) Eligibility for MD State Dual Enrollment Grants requires a 2011 federal adjusted gross income of \$50,000 or less. Eligibility for MC Board of Trustees and College Institute grants require a 2011 federal adjusted gross income of \$86,000 or less.
- Applications will not be reviewed until a completed application WITH appropriate federal tax information has been received.
- The maximum Dual Enrollment grant or Board of Trustees Grant covers the cost of county tuition and fees for one course per semester.
- The College Institute Grant may cover county tuition, fees, and books for courses offered through the College Institute, depending on financial need and **availability of funds**. The grant is generally limited to one course each semester, as well as the one credit course, DS107.
- Students apply for the grant once each academic year. (For example, fall 2012, spring 2013, and summer 2013 is a full academic year.) Grant renewal after the initial semester will depend on the availability of funds. Montgomery College will notify students in writing of their grant awards.
- Students may not receive more than one type of grant during a semester. Students must reapply for high school grants each academic year, as long as they are still enrolled in high school.
