The courses listed are currently transferable under the 2013 SCAD course catalog for specific SCAD requirements for the Bachelor of Fine Arts in Painting. Students are subject to the requirements of the SCAD course catalog in effect at the time of his or her entry and registration at SCAD. Students may choose to fulfill requirements of any subsequent SCAD course catalog within five years of their first enrollment at SCAD. This document is specific to Montgomery College's Studio Art 910 AFA and the Savannah College of Art and Design's Bachelor of Fine Arts in Painting. In order for a class to be considered for transfer, it needs to be at least three semester credit hours or five quarter hours. A grade of "C" or higher must be earned in the class. A course transferred from Montgomery College may fulfill only one SCAD course requirement. A maximum of 18 courses may transfer into the SCAD BFA program of study. In some instances, a student's course selection may fulfill a different requirement than listed above. In those specific instances, it may be advantageous in the student's course of study to allow the course to fulfill a different requirement rather than a general education or free elective.
