Open Educational Resources (OER) are resources that reside in the public domain (or have been released under an intellectual property license that permits their free use or re-purposing by others). OERs include full courses, course materials, modules, textbooks, streaming videos, tests, software, and any other tools, materials, or techniques used to support the teaching and learning processes.

The presenters will address the following questions: Why practice openness? What are the varieties of OER? How can you find OER? Can OER be accessible to students with disabilities? How do you gain local buy-in from multiple constituencies?

Participants will learn about the variety of ways colleges are implementing OERs to benefit students and how they can implement open education practices at their institutions.
